

WHAT'S DIFFERENT BETWEEN BAREFOOT'S CHURCH-BASED DAY CAMP SITES AND BAREFOOT AT THE FARM?

As you consider Barefoot at the Farm instead of (or in addition to!) one of our more traditional, church-based sites, here are the major differences:

Facilities

Barefoot at the Farm - Over 450 acres of outdoor grounds at Amy Grant's farm with the coolness of shaded woods, tents used for small group meeting space and big top tents for large group meeting space (no air conditioning)

Traditional Day Camps - Traditional church settings with indoor classrooms and large indoor meeting spaces (air conditioning)

Activities

Only offered at Barefoot at the Farm- Horseback Riding Specialty, Archery, Mountain Biking, Petting Zoo, Paintball

Only offered at Traditional Day Camps- Extreme Sports (skateboarding, BMX bikes, scooters), Basketball, Pony Rides (no horseback specialty track), Water Inflatables

Transportation

Barefoot at the Farm- Due to the nature of the back country narrow roads leading to Amy Grant's farm, Williamson County is requiring all campers meet at Grassland Elementary. They will ride buses into the camp site.

Traditional Day Camps: Students may be dropped off directly at the camp location. However, additional transportation can be provided for those who live far from the camp venue. Please specify a drop off location on the registration if needed.

Fridays/Closing Ceremonies

Barefoot at the Farm - regular daily schedule until 4 pm, when campers begin to rehearse for closing ceremony performances. That time is followed by a cookout at 5 pm for families, and then closing ceremonies from 6-7:30 pm.

Traditional Day Camps: regular daily schedule until 2:30 pm, when closing ceremonies start. The day still finishes at 4 pm.



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
